

**AGREEMENT OF ARTICULATION  
CO-ENROLLMENT OF STUDENT(S)  
HARRISBURG UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY  
and  
SAINT FRANCIS UNIVERSITY**

Harrisburg University of Science and Technology and Saint Francis University agree to mutually cooperate to coordinate their respective degree programs of study and courses leading to a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Sciences – New Media Design and Production [CIP Code 11.0101] to be awarded by the home institution, Saint Francis University. The principal beneficiaries are the students, who are served by current information about courses and programs and protected by firm arrangements between these accredited institutions of higher education.

PRINCIPLES OF AGREEMENT

Harrisburg University of Science and Technology (HU) and Saint Francis University (SFU) acknowledge, attest, and agree to the following provisions of this agreement, to ensure the fair and equitable treatment of students:

1. This agreement shall apply to students who are scheduled to and/or have completed at least sixty (60) semester hours in the Computer Science program curriculum at SFU.
2. The determination of program requirements for a baccalaureate degree shall be the responsibility of SFU.
3. Students who follow the prescribed baccalaureate degree course requirements at SFU and are scheduled to and/or have attained sixty (60) earned semester hours at SFU may attend HU with junior level status.
4. A completed application or other demographic information sheet is required to the HU Office of Admissions prior to acceptance and registration.
5. SFU shall provide an “official” academic transcript and course registration form to the HU Office of Records and Registration prior to acceptance and registration.
6. The same criteria for evaluating individual coursework for transfer students to HU and satisfactorily meeting course pre-requisites will be applicable to SFU students. Courses must be completed with a grade of “C” (2.00 on a 4.00 scale) or higher.
7. HU agrees to waive diagnostic testing for SFU students who have achieved a grade of “B” or better in their college level general education courses in communication and college algebra (or higher).
8. SFU students attending HU will be treated the same as regular HU students relative to availability and use of campus facilities, student services, lab usage, etc. A laptop computer is required of all students.

9. SFU students attending HU will receive consideration for campus housing on the same basis as HU students of equal class standing.
10. SFU students attending HU will receive equal opportunity to pre-register for classes and have access to other student services on the same basis as HU students of equal class standing.
11. Tuition, housing, meal plan and any other applicable charges to the student for an academic period will be made by SFU. Federal, state, and institutional student financial assistance awards to be credited to a student's account and any other payments will be made by SFU.
12. The SFU student is personally responsible for all meal expenses, transportation costs, books, equipment, and personal expenses while attending HU as an SFU student.
13. HU will invoice SFU for each student calculated as and equal to: the SFU tuition rate and housing charge, minus any SFU institutional grant and scholarship aid credited to the student's account (if any).
14. SFU students attending HU will be treated the same as regular HU students and be subject to all institutional policies, procedures and practices stated in the HU Catalog and Student Handbook, including the student Code of Conduct.
15. The HU Office of Records and Registration will report grades earned by students to the SFU Registrar's Office in accordance with the HU Academic Calendar.
16. This agreement will automatically renew unless personnel from SFU and HU determine that a meeting is necessary to review and/or amend this agreement. Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice of at least one (1) year in advance of the effective date of termination. This agreement will be reviewed every five years. Students in progress will be permitted to complete their SFU program and then transfer.
17. Upon formal approval of this agreement, by the cognizant officials of the two institutions, joint advertisement and promotion will be developed by the appropriate representative at each institution.


