What is this document?

This disclosure shares with Saint Francis University stakeholders the institution's determination concerning whether its Aviation specialization meets the educational prerequistes for licensure in each state.

What is the determination?

Saint Francis University's Aviation Maintenance Technician Program (part 147) is approved by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Because an Aviation Maintenance Technician License (A&P license) is a federally issued license, it has been determined that the Aviation Maintenance Technician Program meets the educational requirements for obtaining an A&P license in every state.

Are there any other requirements for licensure?

Yes, please note that, beyond educational requirements, there may be additional requirements for this license. Only educational requirements are addressed in this determination. Please also note that the information below should not be construed as guaranteeing that any particular professional licensure authority will approve a student's application.

What known requirements are there?

The full eligibility requirements for the Instrument Rating are located in 14 CFR 65, Subpart D. These include English language competency requirements, age requirements, and aeronautical experience.
