

Summer in France

July 1 – 28, 2021
with Dr. Rose Clark & Dr. Edward Zovinka



This 28-day program is based at the University's site in Ambialet. You will explore the French countryside, local castles, incredible cathedrals, museums, restaurants and more. The excursions will take you to many awe-inspiring sites, including a five-day stay in Barcelona.



The price of the program is \$3,178.75 plus the cost of tuition (\$485 per credit). Students must take at least six credits to be eligible for financial aid. The program costs include airfare, airport transfers, international insurance coverage, excursions, on-site transportation, room accommodations and meals.

Program Curriculum

The chemistry and fermentation classes blend in with the European travel experience. Students will study environmental issues with practical hands-on learning while exploring the Tarn river and surroundings including a hydroelectric plant. The fermentation class will explore the fermented foods in Europe with a visit to a cheese cave and taste testing wines from the region.

CHEM 105 Chemistry in the Community (3 credits) The course is designated to provide students an appreciation of chemistry and its impact on all aspects of life. Through the exploration of such environmental issues as sustainability, energy, and nutrition, the future of our world and interconnectedness of nations is analyzed. Present global issues will be addressed from a chemical viewpoint.

CHEM 410 Special Topics Environmental Chemistry in Europe (3-4 credits)
The chemistry of our environment will be studied with special readings on environmental research done in France. Comparisons of environmental conditions affecting the USA and France will be presented. Course will include, lectures, discussions and debates, and some laboratories.

CORE 407 - General Education Keystone Seminar (3 credits) This course will incorporate learning experiences in France and Spain with discussions relating to ethical citizenship and will reflect on the whole general education experience. We will have lots of opportunities to practice collaborative learning and leadership.

FERM 195 Selection Appreciation Topics in Fermentation (3 credits)
Appreciation of fermentation in our society. We will focus on the three major types of fermentation used to make food and drinks.

RLST 390 Early and Medieval Church History & Architecture: Focus on Pilgrimage (3 credits) This course aims to make clearer the policies of the Roman Catholic Church across Western Europe – and especially France - during the Middle Ages. In an introductory class on pre-historical times and Antiquity, we will examine the birth of spirituality and abstract thought in mankind, and then move along to the emergence and development of Christianity during the Roman Empire.

Your Home During the Program

You will stay in Saint Francis University's site, a beautiful renovated historic priory, located in the picturesque Tarn Valley in south-western France. The building overlooks the quaint village of Ambialet. The centuries-old priory has been renovated with modern amenities including onsite washers/dryers and internet. Ambialet is about 20 minutes from Albi (population 50,000), the largest city in the Tarn region of southwest France.

Requirements to Study Abroad

At the time of application students must have a 2.7 GPA for the semester-long program or a 2.5 GPA for any of the short-term programs (anything lower requires approval from the program director). Passing grades (C or better) in key subject areas may also be required. Students must have successfully completed at least one semester, and preferably one year, at Saint Francis University before studying abroad. Students must demonstrate emotional stability and maturity and indicate the ability to lead a responsible and healthy life abroad as a representative of the U.S. and Saint Francis University. Students must submit the application and all travel forms to the Office for Study Abroad (see application process below) before acceptance into any study abroad program will be considered. Previous health, academic, or disciplinary problems, may influence the decision.

Study Abroad Withdrawal Policy

Withdrawal from any Saint Francis University study or service abroad program must be made in writing and delivered to the Office for Study Abroad in person (205 Scotus Hall) or certified mailed (Saint Francis University, Office for Study Abroad, P.O. Box 600, Loretto, PA 15940). The date in which the withdrawal is received at the Office for Study Abroad will determine the amount of refund.

If you withdraw or are withdrawn from your study abroad program you will receive a refund minus: non-refundable application fee, any non-recoverable portion of the airfare, any non-recoverable program costs such as housing payments and deposits, excursion pre-payments, etc. (The closer the program is to the start date the less recoverable costs will be available). Student withdrawals are not accepted after the start of a program.

If you withdraw from the study abroad program, it is also your responsibility to withdraw from your study abroad courses.

Withdrawals from a study abroad program due to lack of passport and/or visa are held to the same withdrawal policies.
