

## AN AFFORDABLE SEMESTER ABROAD FOR EVERY STUDENT

Saint Francis University's semester abroad program in France is a once-ina-lifetime experience available to students in every major. Students stay in the University's renovated facility in Ambialet, located in south-western France. The site is perched on a hilltop overlooking the Tarn River and the village of Ambialet. The program is based in Ambialet but includes extended stays in Paris, Barcelona and Amsterdam. Students profit from numerous visits to important sites in the region. Visits to museums, monuments and natural sites are enhanced by local events. The Fall Semester in France is shorter than the spring semester which means you will not need a visa (a savings of about \$500). The Semester in France is the same tuition, room & board costs as a semester in Loretto. Your financial aid applies. You will see three of Europe's greatest cities and discover a spectacular region of France. You will meet both young and old in every location we visit, as well as in Ambialet, our home village. Castles, museums, hikes, local events, wonderful food, wine and cheese tastings, and great fall weather ... what's not to like?

## SEMESTER IN FRANCE COURSES

The core academic program is 9 credits (FREN, FNAR and RLST). Everyone participates in the 3 core courses because they form the basis of the program, directly linked to nearly all activities, and teach how to approach another culture. The courses are fun and students inevitably appreciate them immensely. Additional courses offered in France (listed below) are optional. Students may also take on-line courses to help maintain their progress toward graduation.

BIOL 205 Human Anatomy and Physiology I (4 credits) Basic course in the study of the structure and function of the human body. The specialized structure and function of each organ system is studied at the cellular, tissue, and organ level of organization, as well as homeostatic mechanisms. This semester specifically covers the integumentary, skeletal, muscular, nervous, and sensory systems. Includes a 3-credit lecture and corresponding 1-credit lab component, both of which will be conducted online. NOTE: To take this course online, a grade of B-or higher in BIOL 111 and BIOL 111 lab is a requirement.

CORE 407 The Creative Power of Identity (3 credits) Is identity a personal discovery, an intentional creation, or a construction provided by cultural and political institutions? Students will examine the concepts of personal and collective identity through the prisms of psychology, sociology, European history and the arts. Students synthesize and apply ideas through written brief reflections, discussions in class, group presentations, and a longer reflective essay related to one of the cities that we visit or our local town, that demonstrates an understanding of identity and an appreciation of diversity. These ideas and concepts will be expanded within the art studio and the Ambialet site. Here students will be individually and collaboratively supported in making artwork that explores questions of identity using traditional and non-traditional processes; painting, sculpture, the body, objects, ritual and time-based work etc.

FNAR 102 Culture and Values (3 credits) An exploration of three European cities, with a focus on the role cities and urban public spaces play in shaping today's European culture and values. In parallel with the historical context and 'built-form' of the city, the course will explore the notion of community and citizenship through lectures, creative project work, and immersive city tours, which will encourage reflection and thinking-in-action about the world around us.

FREN 112 Intensive Elementary French (3 credits) Functional skills in listening, speaking, reading, writing; introduction to French and Francophone culture. Fulfills language requirement. No prerequisite.

FREN 201 Intermediate French I or FREN 202 Intermediate French II (3 credits ea.) Grammar review and further development of communicative skills and cross-cultural competence through cultural readings in French. Focus on oral proficiency and written expression. Prerequisite for 201: FREN 102 or equivalent (3 yrs. of high school French) Prerequisite for 202: FREN 201 or equivalent (4 yrs. of high school French).

RLST 390 Early and Medieval Church History & Architecture: Focus on Pilgrimage (3 credits) This course aims to make clearer the policies of the Roman Catholic Church across Western Europe — and especially France – during the Middle Ages. In an introductory class on pre–historical times and Antiquity, we will examine the birth of spirituality and abstract thought in mankind, and then move along to the emergence and development of Christianity during the Roman Empire.
